LB 43, 604, 901, 923, 1044A, 1050, 1053

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Wesely, there are no further lights on. Do you have closing? Closing's waived. The question is, shall LB 1044A be advanced? All in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Senator Wesely.

SENATOR WESELY: I'd ask for a call of the house.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Wesely has asked for a call of the house. The question is, shall the house go under call? All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 16 ayes, 0 nays to place the house under call, Mr. President.

SPEAKER WITHEM: House is under call. Members in their offices please return to the floor. Unauthorized parties leave the floor. Individuals in the Chamber, Senator Brown, for instance, please record your presence. Call-in votes have been accepted.

CLERK: Landis voting yes.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Record, Mr. Clerk. There has been a request for a record vote. I may have been, if there's going to be a record vote, I may have been a little too prompt in ordering the Clerk to record, then, in that case.

CLERK: (Read record vote. See pages 1061-62 of the Legislative Journal.) 26 ayes, 3 nays, Mr. President, on the advancement of 1044A.

SPEAKER WITHEM: The bill is advanced. Call is raised. Mr. Clerk, do you have any items for the record, by the way?

CLERK: Mr. President, I do, thank you. I have motions to be printed by Senator Bernard-Stevens to LB 604, Senator Wickersham to LB 1050, Senator Beutler to LB 43, Senator Wickersham to LB 1050.
