**SPEAKER WITHEM:** Senator Chambers, you may close on your amendment.

**SENATOR CHAMBERS:** I'm...Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature, I'm wondering if I should close on my amendment or close in on my amendment. I'm just in one of those moods now. Everything is right with the world except for the fact that Senator Coordsen referred to English as the King's English. I understand that the queen was proficient in speaking the language also but, Senator Coordsen, being from the country as you are, you're just repeating what you've always heard, I know that. But there was one of those dramatists who said that as soon as kings, dukes and other noble people found out that what they were speaking was prose they then undertook a conscious effort to improve it and, as a result, everybody spoke better. Now that could be a lesson or it could not. It could be just one of those clever things. But I just want to be able to speak at length on whatever comes before us this session and there are going to be some bills when I'm going to do that in all seriousness, so I'm just kind of slowly working up to it, just kind of like shadowboxing, jogging, before we run stretching a little bit and then, when the real race comes, I want to be able to hit the ground running. And I'm going to be in as mellow a mood at that time as I am now, but I will be as serious, to quote the kids, as a heart attack when I engage in that. I've got colleagues who never show up except for one of those bad votes to drive a stake through my heart, so to speak. I've got a colleague on a committee and I even forget that he's a member of the committee, but he turns up like a bad penny for those bad votes. That's the way it goes around here. And I got something else to say to get out of my system. People apparently trust my ability when it comes to helping them draft language for amendments and bills, but they don't trust my ability when one of these bad bills is to be pulled from committee and some nincompoop county attorney who loses cases tells them, this is what the law means, and I tell you it means something else. You'll even accept what the Attorney General says and I win more cases in the Supreme Court than he does. Every time he goes to court on something he loses, but you listen to him when he's opposed to me, and I've just been thinking about that. Why should I do double work?
