

there. Putting this language in is not going to make them enforce it any differently from the way they enforce it now. But if you leave this language in whereas you won't make them change the way they enforce the law, it will mean that the requirement to enforce other parts of the Rules of the Road is not mandatory. If they don't want to enforce those parts at all they really don't have to. So I'm saying take this language out and make every part of the Rules of the Road stand on the same footing that the officer has got to enforce the law, but, as you pointed out and I pointed out, we understand that with these rules there will be situations when the law is not going to be strictly enforced because it cannot when you take all the facts into consideration.

SENATOR SCHMITT: Right.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So I...oh, okay. I hope that point is clear because maybe I had not made it as clear as I thought I had. So I'm not going to continue speaking but I would like to wait until we all check in before taking a vote.

SPEAKER WITHEM: The house is under call. Again, unauthorized parties should not be on the floor. Members should be seated in their seats and have recorded their presence. We are still seeking the presence of seven members who are not excused, who should be with us. Senator Beutler, please check in. Senator Lindsay, Senator Bernard-Stevens, please report to the floor. Senator Chambers has requested a record vote on the amendment. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Record vote read. See page 1072 of the Legislative Journal.) 13 ayes, 20 nays, Mr. President, on the amendment.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Amendment is not agreed to. The call is raised. Mr. Clerk, next item.
