SENATOR ROBINSON: Yeah. And without this amendment they couldn't even go out of the barn.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: No.

SENATOR ROBINSON: Okay, thank you.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Literally.

SENATOR ROBINSON: Yeah. Yeah.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: That's a literal interpretation of the statute.

SENATOR ROBINSON: Okay. Thank you.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Bernard-Stevens.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Thank you, Speaker Withem. I don't know who to ask. I think, Senator Wesely, would it be proper to ask you the questions, or would you rather, the question we talked about, Senator Schellpeper? I'll go with Senator Wickersham then. On your amendment.... There we go, yeah, one or the other and we picked you. On your amendment, one of the things, I have two questions and it deals actually with the part you're trying to amend. It talks about on the amendment that you're amending to operate with all levels of certified emergency medical care personnel. Do you know, can you answer the question of who can...who can't they work with or operate with now? Is that a better question to ask Senator Schellpeper?

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: I...

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: All right, let me...I'll ask him that question. This is specifically to yours. You made a statement saying that they should be able to provide services that are below their certification. I don't understand what that means.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Okay, if you're an EMT-D service, if you have the proper personnel on board, you offer...those are defibrillators, not the automatic defibrillators...
