or any evidence of ownership, so in order for these stops to be made there should be probable cause, just as if I'm driving on the highway and they want to stop me and I'm not engaged in any violation of a traffic law, there would be probable cause. So we want to do for this situation the same as it would be in others. So I'm asking that you adopt this amendment.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Dierks, on the Chambers amendment.

SENATOR DIERKS: Yes, I think that's a good amendment. We had that drafted originally in the bill. It was changed at the request of some other people. I think it should go back to "probable cause". Thank you.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Further discussion? Senator Chambers, would you like to close on your amendment? Closing is waived. The question before the body is the adoption of the Chambers amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? Record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the amendment to the amendment.

SPEAKER WITHEM: The amendment to the amendment is adopted. Anything further to the committee amendments, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Nothing further, Mr. President.

SPEAKER WITHEM: We are now discussing the committee amendments. Any further discussion on the committee amendments? Seeing none, Senator Dierks, would you like to close? Closing is waived. The question before the body is, shall the committee amendments be adopted? All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 29 ayes, 0 nays, on adoption of committee amendments.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Committee amendments are adopted. Senator Dierks, you would be authorized to open on the bill itself at this point.

SENATOR DIERKS: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature. I think that I have. I think we know what we're
