

person under the age of nineteen years to be used as an undercover agent by a law enforcement agency," and then it talks about the consent of the parent or guardian. Then it appears to me that what we might do with this particular amendment, which is not the bill that was before the committee, which is not the bill that wasn't reported out and then was killed, no. This has had no committee process. This has not had testimony on this particular amendment. There may have been testimony, but it wasn't on this amendment as presented to the committee, and the committee is a part of our process. And I respectfully raise with you that there's an ambiguity here, we now would be covering all individuals, incarcerated, on probation, or on parole. We would be covering all minors, but we would be doing nothing about the situation which gave rise to State v. Howe. when somebody in their majority pre-, or before being charged with a crime, comes into a position of leverage. I only raise the issue not to be critical, but to say we're still not doing it well. It wasn't done right in '78. If you cared about State v. Howe, it's not being done right today. And are we really going to draft everything here on the floor in a hurry and then be proud? We can do better than this. If we'll be faithful to our process, our procedures, and to a recognition of the personalities that are in fact here, that make up the complexion of this body, we can do a better job. We will be back in session next year, God willing. This bill can be introduced. There is an interim to work and confer and research and do a better job. And that's a better use of our time because the people have imposed upon us time limitations and we are now in our fortieth day. I urge your vote in favor of the motion...the vote to reconsider. Thank you.
