

my teaching experience, there are any number of times where I would have been better able to have helped the young person, known more about why there might have been an outburst, been more sensitive to that had there been some sharing of information and we would have known that this individual was having some other difficulties in his or her life. So I think it is important that information needs to be shared, and for that reason, I will be supporting this amendment.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Withem. Senator Bernard-Stevens.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Thank you, Madam President. Senator Withem was...one of the things you need to learn is how to extend that whole five minutes. I understand that, so I will give you some lessons when I needed to. Senator Withem was giving a good explanation plus giving Senator Chambers some time. I do want to reiterate one thing, and I will concur with the Chambers amendment at this point, and maybe if Senator Chambers and Senator Wesely wish to combine their amendment, it might work out very well, too, as long as they are up there. But the whole key to success on 1044, if there is going to be success, is that we be able to look at our clients in the eye and say we understand there is multitude of problems out there. We have the people that are going to be in the same room working together, combining all of that information to find the best delivery of service for that individual. We have not done a good job of that. That's a part of the rationale behind 1044, and that's why I believe this amendment will clarify that portion while still, at the same time, maintaining the confidentiality that Senator Dierke was concerned about, and, quite honestly, I was, too. And I thank the Chair.
