SENATOR JENSEN: Well, I want to be assured at the end that there is some money to be made.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And if there's as much chance that it won't be made as that it will be made, would you undertake to do it?

SENATOR JENSEN: No, I would not.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: If there's a chance that you may lose money, would you do it?

SENATOR JENSEN: No, I would not.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Jensen, we're looking at a serious act to be placed by this Legislature. We're talking about making some radical or drastic changes. There is no plan for implementation. Do you nevertheless feel comfortable doing this and taking this huge leap of faith, as some people have characterized it?

SENATOR JENSEN: I did support the bill in committee, I support it on the floor. I do have an amendment that hopefully we'll have time to consider, that takes a look at the intent language,
