

resources to front-line positions; number three, provide retraining and transfer opportunities within the partnership or other agencies of state government; and, number four, reduce the work force by attrition. So I think we can see that there are ways that are already in place that it has been anticipated in this process that we do look for savings. As organizations move to a function-based approach, people need to be cross-trained and retrained, it's a very different system than the hierarchical system that we are used to, and it is a way that we can eliminate duplication. So I do believe that we have some indication that there has been concern on the part of the people who are putting together this plan and this bill that there will be cost savings. But I still think that we need to look at the intent language and have that as one of the things that is in front of us in the intent language. So I will probably be supporting Senator Jensen's amendment. Thank you.
