

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See page 1146 of the Legislative Journal.) 27 ayes, 18 nays, Madam President.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The Jensen amendment is adopted. I raise the call. Senator Hilgert announces the following guests are visiting the Legislature, Wendy Costello is here from Lincoln. She is under the south balcony. And Senator Hartnett announces that there are 30 eighth graders here from Logan Middle School, in Bellevue, Nebraska. (Introduced their teacher.) They're in the north balcony. Will you all stand and be recognized, please. Welcome to the Legislature. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Senator Avery now has AM3683. Senator, I have a note you want to withdraw 3683 and offer, as a substitute, 3687.

SENATOR AVERY: Yes.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Seeing no objections.... There is an objection. Senator...Senator, you either move to substitute, or.... Senator, you must either go with the original amendment, or move to substitute as there is an objection to your substitution request.

SENATOR AVERY: I'll move to substitute.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The motion before the body.... Is there any discussion on the motion to substitute? Seeing none, the question before you is the motion to substitute the second Avery amendment for the first Avery amendment. All those in favor vote aye; all those opposed vote nay. Please record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 3 nays on the motion to substitute the amendments.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The motion to substitute succeeds. Senator Avery, to open on his amendment. (Avery amendment, AM3687, can be found on page 1147 of the Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR AVERY: Thank you, Madam President. This amendment amends the section dealing with the plan. It does not do anything in terms of the time frame, the January 1997 time frame that the plan is to be implemented. That process has been talked about and addressed and addressed and has not happened.
