SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Madam President and members. And, Senator Chambers, you can color me confused. So I do have to...I took down everything you said, I wrote it all down, but I still am not...my one question is, does this subject this group to the open meetings or not.

SENATOR CROSBY: They do not have to meet...they do not have to follow the open meetings rule.

The way the bill is drafted right now, the green copy, the intent is to state that this policy cabinet is not subject to the open meetings law.
