PRESIDENT ROBAK: One minute.

But I say again, and I've quoted it before, all rivers and most men and women are crooked because they follow the path of least resistance. That's what LB 1044 and 1044A are. They are together a tribute to that which makes all rivers and most men and women crooked. We followed, as a Legislature, the path of least resistance and it was an irresponsible path in my opinion.
