

to speak on the Wickersham amendment?

SENATOR VRTISKA: Yes, I do. No, I don't. I'm sorry, I was thinking Withem. (Laughter.)

SENATOR CROSBY: Senator Cudaback, did you wish to speak on the Wickersham amendment? Senator Withem already spoke. So, any further question, any further debate on the Wickersham amendment to the Withem amendment? Seeing none, Senator Wickersham, would you like to close? He waives closing. The question is the adoption of the Wickersham amendment to the Withem amendment to 1205. All in favor vote aye, opposed no. Record, please.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on the adoption of Senator Wickersham's amendment.

SENATOR CROSBY: The amendment is adopted. We're now back to the...back to the Withem amendment. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Madam President, I would like to ask Senator Withem a question.

SENATOR CROSBY: Senator Withem, will you yield for a question?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Withem, which of your amendments are we dealing with at this point, because if I understand correctly, you withdrew that first one calling for that....

SPEAKER WITHEM: I withdrew the one calling for the fiscal analysis of it, and we are now on the one that's on your desk, 3724. There's a slight modification in this one that doesn't change the intent of it.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And could you tell me what it does.

SPEAKER WITHEM: This is a requirement that the...the explanation of it...it says it's an explanation of 3604. This is basically it, if you want to refer to it later. But it basically says that as opposed to the current bill, which would sell all of the property, that my amendment would say they would be obligated to sell enough of their property that would result in a one-third of the total value in land and two-thirds in other investments.
