

budget, and so the community-based programs will be expanded statewide. LB 1046 is what 1141 will become. If you remember that in the original juvenile justice bill, 988, we had a sunset on Geneva, because it was assumed that we would have the community-based programs up and operating statewide by the end of this year. Obviously, when we don't have dollars that are asked for, either in the Governor's budget, or even in the Attorney General's crime package, so I can be fair to both, that can't happen. And so what this bill does is it simply takes away the sunset of the evaluations that must be done at Geneva, takes away that sunset of December 31, 1996, and inserts the following, which is 1096 with one change, "The community-based evaluation services shall replace the evaluation services available at the Youth Diagnostic and Rehabilitation Center". And then there's a sunset on it again by December 31, 1999. And the reason I still want to have the sunset and the reason it's 1999 is that the goal of the community-based programs is to replace those services. I don't want to have a dual evaluation. And next year, in the biennial budget, it's my hope that we get the community-based programming up to where it has to be. In that two-year period, we should be able then to replace, during that time, the evaluation process at Geneva, and then we can get rid of that and go to the new process that we're developing on 988, the juvenile justice bill. I would urge its adoption. If we don't adopt the amendment, the community-based programs, which are not statewide, cannot pick up the slack on the evaluations, obviously, and the evaluations would cease as of the end of this fiscal year. So I would urge the adoption of the amendment.

SENATOR WILL: Thank you. You've heard the opening on the Bernard-Stevens amendment. For purposes of discussion, Senator Wehrbein.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes, Mr. Speaker, members, do you want to clarify any fiscal change in that as far as keeping that open there, Senator Bernard-Stevens?

SENATOR WILL: Senator Bernard-Stevens.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Go ahead, Roger, I'm not sure where you're going, but if you want to clarify it, that would be fine.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Is there any change in the fiscal note in
