

SENATOR WILL: For discussion on 1141A, Senator Bernard-Stevens.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Yeah, there is a question that I must admit in the activity this morning that I have not, in my mind, I'm not clear in my mind. And so, Senator Wehrbein, I'd like to ask you a question. And maybe if Kate's down in fiscal and she can verify something for us, I'd appreciate that. The question that I have, on 1141A, obviously the 3.3 million that was in the A bill goes away because we gutted that portion of 1141. The question I do have, however, is when...in the budget that you have pending, that will be before us Wednesday, will the fact that we extend the evaluation process for Geneva, does that require then dollars to be put in 1141A to do that? Or is that something that's taken care of, we can take care of in the appropriations budget? I'd just like to have Senator Wehrbein's thoughts on that, if he's able to at this time.

SENATOR WILL: Senator Wehrbein.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Would you repeat the question.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Yeah, I know you're on the phone and I was actually trying to give you some time. I do have a question in my own mind whether we, when we...the sunset that was reflected in the Geneva, the Diagnostic Center, I assume the funding for the evaluations was also going to sunset by that time period. When we extend that sunset to December 31 of '99, is there any need to continue funding or to add funding for those evaluations because it was going to be sunsetted? And I don't have an answer for that question.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Senator Bernard-Stevens, the answer to that is we have the money in for '96-97 in the budget also, a continuation budget for one more year, currently, in Geneva,...

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Okay, all right. So...

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: ...which includes other things, it's 552,000, it includes evaluation,...

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Okay.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: ...as well as staffing. There obviously is not money beyond this biennium.
