

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Thank you.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator. Senator Wehrbein.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Madam Speaker, members, Madam President, and members, I want to understand. Senator Avery, did you...are you in this same amendment?

SENATOR AVERY: Yes.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Madam President, and members, Senator Avery, may I ask Senator Avery a question, Madam. Senator Avery, did you lower this from 75 to 70 in this amendment also...

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Senator Avery.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: ...on the interstate?

SENATOR AVERY: Right, that's...that's one provision in there...

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: ...on the interstate.

SENATOR AVERY: ...that in there that I (interruption)...

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: ...and then said if you do go over 70, you will not lose any points until 75.

SENATOR AVERY: Right.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: And you lowered the fine.

SENATOR AVERY: And I lowered the fine there...

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: All right.

SENATOR AVERY: ...from 25 to 10 dollars.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: I am going to oppose this amendment, and one of the things I have felt quite adamantly about in the past is the so-called fudge factor. I think we ought to have...either have a speed limit or we don't, and to me, this type of thing encourages those to exceed the speed limit because there is no cost. And if we are going to do that, then it just simply breeds the disregard for the law, of which I think we have
