PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. The question be...there has been a request for a call of the house. All those in favor vote aye; all those opposed vote nay. Please record.

CLERK: 18 ayes, 0 nays to place the house under call.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The house is under call. Will senators please return to their seats. Will all unauthorized personnel please leave the floor, the house is under call. Senators, please check in. Senator Fisher, Senator Engel, Senator Bromm, Senator Witek, Senator Pirsch, Senator Schimek, Senator Withem, Senator Avery, Senator Robinson, Senator Vrtiska, Senator Hartnett, Senator Matzke, Senator Robak, Senator Brown, Senator Hilgert, thank you. Senator Lynch and Senator Lindsay, and Senator Hillman. Senator Hartnett, will you check in, please. Senator Robak. Senator Robinson, will you check in, please. Thank you. We're waiting for Senator Lindsay. The question before the body is the adoption of the Chambers amendment to LB 901. All those in favor vote aye; all those opposed vote nay. Please record. Senator Chambers has requested a roll call vote. Mr. Clerk, please proceed.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See page 1204 of the Legislative Journal.) 28 ayes, 16 nays on the amendment.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The amendment is adopted. I raise the call. Is there anything further on the bill, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Senator Avery has an amendment pending.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: You wish to withdraw that, Senator? It is withdrawn.

CLERK: I have nothing further on the bill, Madam President.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Is there any further discussion on LB 901? Seeing none, Senator Chambers, to close, on the bill. Closing
