SENATOR ROBINSON: I don't even remember them coming in, so...

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Schimek. Senator Wehrbein.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes, Madam Speaker, members, I just simply want to say that I support this, but with...the recognition needs to be that by broadening the scope, even though there is ample money appropriated at this point, we're only using about 600 thousand out of 750, there is a possibility down the road, of course, with more use and widening of the scope that there could be more money spent. I just wanted the Legislature to recognize that may happen in the future. Thank you.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator. Senator Hillman.

SENATOR HILLMAN: Yes, how much time, Madam Chairman?

PRESIDENT ROFAK: There's nine minutes remaining.

SENATOR HILLMAN: Senator Robinson, if you could answer a quick question to clarify.

SENATOR ROBINSON: Okay.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Senator Robinson.

SENATOR HILLMAN: When we talk about a 50 percent tuition credit, that's 50 percent of what the tuition charges are. In other words,...

SENATOR ROBINSON: It would...you would take what 50 percent of the tuition charge would be at UNL. They would not receive any more than that. They wouldn't receive 50 percent of what it is at the independent college,...

SENATOR HILLMAN: Okay.

SENATOR ROBINSON: ...only what it is a UNL.

SENATOR HILLMAN: Okay. That was my question, thank you.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Hillman. Senator Robinson.
