As you know, this is a very sensitive and delicate kind of balance for us now. But I told him I would get together these people...with these people and they could sit down in conference with them and run his amendments by them and talk about them in a setting where there could be some back and forth and some playing around with language and some ideas shared. And I would ask you if you would be inclined perhaps to do the same thing, because I think, if there's a way of giving a message to Kansas here, that nobody would be...would object to that, if it can be done in such a way so as not to be detrimental to the bill. Would that be of any interest to you?

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Yes, it would, certainly, and I'd be pleased to participate.

SENATOR BEUTLER: If that's the case, Senator, if you'd be willing to withdraw the amendment, I'll be sure that you're part of that conference.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Mr. Speaker, I'll withdraw the amendment, if you will, please.

SPEAKER WITHFM: Thank you. The amendment is withdrawn. Just as an indication to the membership of how I'm going to be conducting things up here today. There are appropriately a lot of lights on, on each amendment. As we move from one item to another, I am going to be clearing the light board.
