SPEAKER WITHEM: All of those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Record.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of committee amendments.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Committee amendments are adopted. Senator Robak, would you like to open on your bill?

SENATOR ROBAK: Thank you, Mr. Speaker and members of the body. Senator Hartnett has done an excellent job of explaining the committee amendments which now make the bill. The original 1211 was brought to me by the League of Municipalities. And we have put five bills into one bill and Senator Hartnett has done an excellent job of explaining that. With Senator Lynch's amendment, now I just ask the advancement of LB 1211. Thank you.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator, there are no further lights on. Do you have anything else to say in closing? Closing's waived. The question is, shall LB 1211 be advanced? All in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Record.
