side of that, Senator Bernard-Stevens, that I would say, what are you going to do with \$10,000 at the last minute? I mean you can only spend so much at zero hour. So I, just point of thought.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Brashear, there are no further lights on. Would you care to close?

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature, only, I'd like to close only briefly to correct an error in the record. I am reliably informed that the revenue goes to the Campaign Finance Limitation Act and not to the Accountability and Disclosure Commission so I hope that Senator Bernard-Stevens heard that. Secondly, I would like to assure the members of the body that there is much in this act that I think is beneficial and improves the act, or much in this bill that improves the act, and basically it became a matter of political reality, expediency, and the manner in which the consent calendar works to make the amendment deletion of which Senator Bernard-Stevens complains. There will be much good accomplished by simply advancing the bill as it is and would urge you to do so.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Having heard the closing the question now before the body is, shall LB 1263 be advanced? All of those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 2 nays, Mr. President, on the advancement of LB 1263.

SPEAKER WITHEM: LB 1263 advances. Mr. Clerk, are there any messages, reports, or announcements?

CLERK: Mr. President, your committee on Enrollment and Review reports they've carefully examined and engrossed Legislative Bill 43, find the same correctly engrossed: (LB) 972, (LB) 1028, and (LB) 1121. Mr. President, a series of amendments: Senator Withem has amendments to LB 604 to be printed; Senator Maurstad to LB 253A; Senator Dierks to LB 108; Senator Schimek to LB 1189; Senator Wehrbein to LB 1189.
