LB 1162, 1363

SENATOR MAURSTAD: Madam President, I'd move to adopt the E & R amendments to LB 1162.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Is there any discussion? Seeing none, the question before you is the adoption of the E & R amendments to LB 1162. All those in favor say aye. All those opposed nay. The E & R amendments are adopted.

CLERK: I have nothing further on the bill, Senator.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Senator Maurstad.

SENATOR MAURSTAD: Madam President, I'd move to advance LB 1162 to E & R for engrossment.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Is there any discussion? Seeing none, the question before you is the advancement of LB 1162. All those in favor say aye. All those opposed nay. LB 1162 advances. LB 1363.

CLERK: LB 1363, no E & R. Senator Maurstad would move to amend the bill.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The Chair recognizes Senator Maurstad to open on his amendment.

SENATOR MAURSTAD: Thank you, Madam President. And very quickly, this would be the same type of an amendment that we addressed last night on the SID bill dealing with the necessity of putting on the bonded indebtedness amount on tax statements. I've visited with the chairman of the committee and we've come to an agreement so I would not discuss this any further, but would yield any time that Senator Hartnett might want.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Senator, there are four and a half minutes remaining.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Madam Chairman and members of the body, I think in our debate last night on the SID bill I think Senator Maurstad raised a good point. If we're only going to do it with bond indebtedness or...we shouldn't do it on the cities and just SIDs, we should do it in all political subdivisions. So I'm going to plan to work with him.
