SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Jim, I do have one serious question, I don't want to take much time on it so if we start running out I'll stop and we can go to Select File.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: There's five and a half minutes remaining.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Thank you. On the bill? Thank you. Senator Cudaback, refresh me, though, just a little bit on people being allowed to get on private property. Is that a concern at all that if I have private property of which a cemetery is on, that it now is opened up to anybody who wishes to enter my private property or a person's private property?

SENATOR CUDABACK: November, December, and January, and February. And the landowner can specify where these people can walk...

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: But the point is that during those months, I, the landowner, if I wanted to specify that they can walk outside of my property line, can I do so? In other words, they cannot enter?

SENATOR CUDABACK: I don't think they could probably stop you from coming on it if you're going to the cemetery.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Right. And that's the only question that I do really have and I'm going to have to think about, and I'm certainly not going to...I raise the question now so that on Select File...I'm a little uncomfortable of people having private property and saying, for X number of months out of the year anybody who wants to can go on that private property, with or without permission. That does concern me a little bit, but, again, I'm going to think about that a little bit. But it may be a question we want to talk about when, General to Select File.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you. Is there any further discussion on the advancement of LB 932? Seeing none, Senator Cudaback to close. Closing is waived. The question before you is the advancement of LB 932. All those in favor vote aye; all those opposed vote nay. Please record.
