I'm curious as to where the...where corrections would be finding the additional money for the development of that planning and design document, and I hope it does...hope they support the development of the design document.

SENATOR CROSBY: One minute.

SENATOR MAURSTAD: It's been over 15 years since we've had a major study addressing the need for minimum-medium security. We don't have a current planning document. I think we need that. And I'm going to consider, seriously consider introducing an amendment to build four of these. If two is okay, three is okay, then it seems to me that the data would indicate that four is what actually meets the short-term need. And so if we're going to in fact go down this route, maybe that's what the Legislature should consider at this time. That would increase it another couple million dollars, up to 7 million and some change, so people have an idea what this all leading up to. Thank you.
