

you find out who your enemy is. It is not your black brother. It is not your black sister, snatching you off these streets and throwing you behind bars for life, when they have framed you. And they do improperly arrest and charge young black men. One was charged, in the most recent cop killing case, for first degree murder. They went into the projects in South Omaha where poor black people live, they treated them like Nazi's treated Jews when they rounded them up in their ghettos to take them to the concentration camps and hauled them off to prison, and the one, who is 21-years old and eligible for the death penalty stayed in jail languishing for months, and then you know what happened? They had to admit he wasn't even at the scene. He was...he is a statistic. Here's a young black man arrested and charged with first degree murder for killing a cop, so that gives the racist another statistic against young black men. But he was not at the scene, and they had to drop charges and let him go, and he stayed in prison under a charge of first degree murder, then they impanel a hanging white jury, and I watch this, and our young men watch it, and do you know what I tell people, like the guy who was in Scotland and went in that school and killed these babies. If you're going to kill somebody, go to the police station, go to the army barracks, and if you've got to kill 16 people, kill those kind of people who make a living and a life out of oppressing others, carrying out racist activities with the knowledge and complicity of judges and legislators. And if it's a war that we are in, and they are going to kill us, they have determined the nature of this struggle, and young black men are not afraid to die, but they are dying for the wrong reason, and they are killing the wrong people. I look at what these people in northern Ireland are doing, and here Jerry Adams is a hero in this country. He is backed by Kennedy, Ted Kennedy, all of that group of Irish people, backed by the President of the United States, and they take credit for blowing up innocent people, and they are romantic heroes. We, as black people, are treated worse in this country than they are treated in Ireland. And suppose we started doing to white people what they've done to us, and don't think the day will not come and don't think it cannot come. We are dying at your hands and in your prisons anyway for nothing. Why should I tell a young man, yeah, you waste away, spend your whole life in prison for something that a white man wouldn't even get arrested and charged for. No, you do something else with your life and it's better that it ends right now, in striking a blow for the freedom of black people, than to go on
