I didn't run to the media, scared, and saying he's telling he is going to kill me. You've got cowards on these police forces, and we have to deal with them, and when we deal with them, we wind up going to prison, and never do they find that a white cop has done anything wrong when it comes to the violation of the rights of black people in Omaha. That's what I have to deal with. Senator Vrtiska can come down here and say for my county we need several hundred thousands of dollars and you give it to him, and Senator Vrtiska did a good job in getting it, so I'm not condemning you for that. I am just using that as an example of how white people stick with white people. This commission was created by a law passed by this white Legislature and they did not put an A bill with it to give it money. So the white people in the Legislature said, we are going to give them the money anyway, and that's one of the amendments I have to strike that, but, again, it shows how white people stick with white people. You could have come in here and put some kind of A bill or something, if you chose, but you don't have to because the law means what you say it means. And if you say we disregard this law, we disregard this law. And the law that you write is written in pencil that has a big eraser, and you can erase it and change it whenever you want to, to fit your whim. But then when you write something in that's designed to crush black people, it is engraved in steel, and those who have to administer these unjust rules, like your federal judges, can go to the white leaders, whose job it is to enact fair and just laws under the United States Constitution, and can tell them what you're doing is wrong, it is racist, it is discriminatory, and your constitution talks about liberty and justice for all. The Declaration talks about all men being created equal. We know all of that is a lot of hogwash, but to so blatantly depart from it, in the halls of Congress, where laws are passed supposedly for everybody, and they depart from it knowing that they are engaging in racism and discrimination...
