SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator, it was. It was in LB 1385.

SENATOR CROSBY: Okay, 1385, yeah, that's the one I thought probably it was.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Which was advanced without,...

SENATOR CROSBY: Okay. And the NRDs were...

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...unanimously by the committee. And the NRDs were...

SENATOR CROSBY: They were supportive. And the resources commissions, more or less.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Yes, well, the answer is yes. We amended the bill to essentially adopt their concept of how it should be studied.

SENATOR CROSBY: Okay.

SENATOR BEUTLER: How they would like to do it. It is not word for word,...

SENATOR CROSBY: Yeah, I understand.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...but I think, my guess is, honestly, that they do, they would approve of this approach.

SENATOR CROSBY: That they do feel like it's a good tool to help, yeah. I had some of the same apprehensions that Senator Kristensen had, that we could introduce a whole bunch of studies into this particular bill or introduce some interim studies and so on and get the answers. But I just wanted to be sure on this particular amendment that we weren't singling out one particular subdivision to do something like this. So I think probably I will vote for it, but I do, I am a little concerned about putting too much, so much into LB 1085. So, thank you.
