SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So that date would be the first Thursday after the first Tuesday in January...

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...following the general election that would occur after one of these township officers is elected? Is that how this operates? We would have an election of a township officer...

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: What you...what you...Senator, what you would have is an election, typically, in November; the following January is the date on which officers that were elected would take office, that's the date the consolidation agreement becomes effective, that's the date that any incumbents that weren't elected as officers of the consolidated entity, their terms would end, if they had not ended by other means.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And that would include county commissioners?

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: That's correct.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And this county supervisor?

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: That's correct.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Any office that would be affected.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Yes, any officer that wasn't elected pursuant to the consolidation agreement. There's actually a mess for putting...
