

Section 31-409.03, line 10 of page 2 of the Standing Committee amendment. Okay?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Yes.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: And when I read that, I see the precincts shall be established to include as nearly as possible, we strike out "equal acreage" and go to equal units of benefit. Just from my remembering of those, does that deal with the one person, one vote issues?

SENATOR BEUTLER: I don't think it has. Senator, I'd have to...I am going to have to look back at that.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: I don't...I don't know the answer (interruption)...

SENATOR BEUTLER: I don't...I don't know so, obviously,...

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: ...that's the flag that jumps up at me when I see those.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...it...I didn't look at it from that perspective.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: And I know that that debate causes all sorts of fervor in this body.

SENATOR BEUTLER: If I am remembering correctly, they vote in accordance with the number of acres in a unit benefitted, and I don't think that changes, but I will check that for you to be sure that's the case, in case you're concerned about a vote...a shift in voting power.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Yeah, that's my problem with...I have been doing property tax long enough that when I start to see other stuff come on it, it makes me nervous that I am buying, innocently buying some other things on the bill.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Yes. Well, I will check that to be sure that's not the case.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Thank you. Madam President, I'd yield back the rest of my time. Thank you.
