SENATOR WARNER: ...1114 because that specifically deals with levy setting...

SENATOR BEUTLER: Well, if you would...

SENATOR WARNER: ...and authorization for property taxes.

SENATOR BEUTLER: If you would yield me 30 more seconds of your time, Senator.

SENATOR WARNER: Just did.

SENATOR BEUTLER: In that case, Mr. Clerk, I would withdraw the amendment in light of the fact that it appears to be more appropriate on the other bill, and it will also give Senator Wickersham and others a chance to review the material in the amendment. Thank you.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The amendment is withdrawn. We have now, Mr. Clerk, another amendment.
