statutes, and that's the incentive, and I firmly believe, as permissive as one can say this legislation is, you can connect or associate it with the rest of the bills, and the necessity if local government wishes to spend more than is permitted by law, they have to go to a vote, then a vote to bring about more cost-effective government rather than a vote to increase authorized levies is going to be the incentive that gets people, as a state, get us as a state to where a lot of people want to go. I think it could very effective and I hope the body will advance the bill.

SENATOR WILL: Thank you, Senator Warner. You conclude the closing. The issue before the body is the advancement of LB 1085 to E & R Initial. All those in favor vote aye, opposed no. Have you all voted? Mr. Clerk, please record.

CLERK: 38 ayes, 1 nay, Mr. President, on the advancement of 1085.

SENATOR WILL: LB 1085 advances. Mr. Clerk, items for the record.

CLERK: Mr. President, a bill read on Final Reading and reconsidered this morning has been presented to the Governor. (Re: LB 296.) Amendments to be printed, Senator Kristensen to LB 901; Senator Bernard-Stevens to LB 1189; Senator Chambers to LB 1273; Senator Coordsen to LB 901; Senator Wickersham, LB 1296. That's all that I have, Mr. President. (See pages 1316-18 of the Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR WILL: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. We now move to LR 292CA. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, LR 292CA, introduced by the Revenue Committee and signed by its members. (Read brief explanation.) The resolution was introduced on January 8 of this year. At that time it was referred to the Revenue Committee. The resolution was advanced to General File. There are committee amendments pending by the Revenue Committee, Mr. President. (See AM3650 found on page 1161 of the Legislative Journal.)
