SENATOR BROMM: Thank you, Senator Crosby. If Senator Bohlke would be able to yield to a couple of questions, if she's...

SENATOR CROSBY: Senator Bohlke, will you yield?

And I'm not talking dollars, but I'm talking about, you know, concepts and how it will affect them.

SENATOR BOHLKE: And I'm sorry, I had a phone call there, Senator Bromm, but...

SENATOR BOHLKE: ..you're saying with...by not...by the reconsider...supporting the reconsideration, what does that do?

SENATOR BROMM: We take the Schimek amendment out...

SENATOR BOHLKE: Out, and what's that...

SENATOR BROMM: ..so special ed...

SENATOR BOHLKE: ..going to do?

SENATOR BROMM: ..special ed is out of the mix and we go ahead with the rest of 1050, and I've got a district that educates a lot of special ed kids...

SENATOR BOHLKE: Right, as do I.

SENATOR BROMM: ..from all over the area and, you know, we're going to have some possible levy caps here. What...how are they going to be impacted?
