

SENATOR BOHLKE: Well, he had not...he had not been moved to Geneva yet. I mean he was on and named to the task force before he accepted that position at Geneva. He was asked to be on it for that very reason.

SENATOR STUHR: But actually wasn't representing a nonequalized school.

SENATOR BOHLKE: Yes, he did, very strongly.

SENATOR STUHR: Okay.

SENATOR BOHLKE: And represented NRCSA, really.

SENATOR STUHR: All right.

SENATOR BOHLKE: And he would tell you that.

SENATOR STUHR: Okay.

SENATOR BOHLKE: I also have a number of nonequalized schools, and I was on that task force.

SENATOR STUHR: How many members were there? I don't actually know.

SENATOR BOHLKE: There were five.

SENATOR STUHR: Five.

SENATOR CROSBY: One minute.

SENATOR STUHR: Okay, so there were probably two (inaudible).

SENATOR BOHLKE: There were probably two, and what...the other thing we tried to do was get...we had representation from the Gering School District, so we tried to get from across the state, from Gering to the middle of the state, to the eastern part of the state. So we looked at that, and then, like I said, we had two out of...and I'm not quite sure if five is right, but of those who represented nonequalized schools.
