SENATOR CROSBY: There's a request for a call of the house. All in favor vote aye, opposed no. Record, please.

CLERK: 20 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, to place the house under call.

SENATOR CROSBY: The house is under call. Would all senators please record your presence. Would all unexcused senators please return to the floor and record your presence. Would all unauthorized personnel please leave the floor. The house is under call. Senator Bromm, are you going to close while they're coming to the Chamber?

SENATOR BROMM: Yes, I will, Senator Crosby.

SENATOR CROSBY: Go ahead.
