PRESIDENT ROBAK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...little feelings get hurt if a negative editorial is written or if somebody is extremely critical of us. We whine and pout. But then when it comes to the young people we want to build a prison and then I say again, after coming out of this environment, which produces predictable results, some people act surprised when that which is predictable actually comes to pass. These young people are not going to be locked up forever. They are not going to learn how to be good citizens in a junior prison. Expect them to be hardened. Expect them to be more cynical and expect them to see worse things being done by guards and Corrections personnel in bringing contraband into the prison to them, than they were before they went in.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Time.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I support Senator Pedersen's amendment.
