I, you know, get to the point you really don't care much, but it's just a matter of truth that we are a good old boy society and I guess that we overlook that a lot. Thank you.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Thank you, Senator Robak. There are no other lights on. Senator Chambers to close.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Mr. President and members of the Legislature. I hear people speaking from frustration. For example, Senator Robak and Senator Schimek, who say words to this effect, it reaches the point where you really don't care too much one way or the other, but I must care all of the time. My flame is never diminished. My fire is never banked. And those of you all who have issues and you need help on, you come to me because you know I don't flame out. You know I don't get tired and burn out. You know that when that issue comes up and it involves people or a group who need some help, I will give any help that I can give and I don't say I'm too tired or I just don't care anymore. And when there are those differences it shows why, when these kind of outfits are put together, you cannot draw all of the representation from one segment of society, because they don't care. They care about their interests and the groups that they have to go back and keep faith with, but you can see how things are done on this floor. There are certain groups and interests that just don't command the same assistance as others. Senator Robak, if you were...if you could get the support for some of the bills that you offer for the mentally handicapped that people get for Union Pacific and Micron you could just sit back like you are right now and be relaxed and let the train roll without doing a thing, but you and I both know that will never happen. Our battles never stay won if we ever seem to win them. We have to continue to fight the same battle over and over and over. But this good old boy
