Others fold too quickly, but I'm like that old check that they used to send you--do not fold, spindle or mutilate--because this one will fight back. And you all can go along to get along, but I won't. And I'm going to raise the issue again on Select File and I'm going to go through the discussion again. This needs to be talked about on the floor of the Legislature and what more appropriate context in which to discuss it than when we're considering revision of the constitution, the organic law of this state which is supposed to embrace the rights of us all? Yet, we know some of us are outside the pale in the way that we're mistreated. But the others reach the point where they're tired, they're frustrated, they feel helpless so they don't really care anymore, but I do and I will continue to do as I'm doing. I'm going to ask...

SENATOR COORDSEN: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ..I'm going to ask for a call of the house after I finish, 'cause I want to use that minute. Senator Robak, this may be the last deed I will do on this earth before going to meet my face, whatever it is, wherever it is. And if I should be cut down I want to be cut down doing what it is I think I ought to do. Now don't you all get too happy. I haven't gotten the word that I got terminal cancer or anything. I'm just speaking kind of allegorically or figuratively. But that day will come for all of us and when that unkind fate intervenes it should find us doing that which we say we think is the right thing to do. I started, Senator Pirsch, to fake a heart attack, but I'm not quite up to that. Maybe if I were Senator Landis and a thespian I would, but I can't quite pull that one off.
