SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Okay, thank you, Senator, Senator Wehrbein. Members of the body, I'm going to vote no even though the amendment is, in itself innocuous, because in essence what we're doing is we're going to remind ourselves that we want to be sure and look at these things and we're going to remind the department that they sure better look at these things and the department says we're going to do it ourselves with our own money so you don't have to give us any money, and these are the type of amendments that I look at, and not to Senator Wehrbein, because he's doing it on behalf of Senator Lindsay, but these are the types of amendments that I look at as I shake my head. We'll spend time to do something like this. We're not going to...we may not do something for community colleges, whatever, but we're sure going to make sure to do something that, (A) it's not going to do anything, and (B) the department's going to do it themselves anyway and they've already been in consultation with. I...these are the amendments that just...that I just shake my head and ask why. And this particular amendment, I'm sure it will pass, I'll be voting no, but just remember we're just stating I guess for us so that we remember those are the numbers we want. The department understands those are what we want. They understand those are the numbers they need. They're going to do it themselves under their own budget. They're going to take the manpower and do it themselves. There is no need for an amendment like this and so, at this point, unless somebody can show me where it's going to make a difference, I vote no because it doesn't do anything, period.
