60 days. With that, I'd ask for the adoption of the amendment.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Hartnett, there are no lights on. Would you like to close on the committee amendments? Committee amendments are before the body. The question is, shall they be adopted? All in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Record.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the committee amendments.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Amendments adopted. Senator Hartnett, you're recognized to open.

SENATOR HARTNETT: As I explained in the opening on the committee amendments, the purpose of the bill is to require that warrants issued for operation and maintenance expenses be issued no later than 60 days following the date upon which a district is in receipt of the bill for the amount of operation and maintenance expense owed. It simply puts a time line on SIDs so that they will have a timely period. There is nothing in statutes. So, with that, I'd ask for the advancement of 1321 unless there's any questions.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Thank you, Senator. Are there no lights on? Do you have anything additional to say in closing? The question is, shall LB 1321 be advanced? All in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Record.

CLERK: 31 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the advancement of 1321.

SPEAKER WITHEM: LB 1321 advances. LB 1304.

CLERK: LB 1304, by Senator Lynch. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 18, referred to Urban Affairs, advanced to General File. There are committee amendments, Mr. President.

SPEAKER WITHEM: On the committee amendments, Senator Hartnett.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Mr. Speaker and members of the body, this bill relates to cities of all classes, village, and certain counties, and would change provision with regard to plumbing codes. It would require cities, villages, and counties which have not adopted a plumbing code to adopt the American National
