SENATOR WITEK: Not on the amendment, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER WITHEM: On the bill, okay, we'll...I'm sorry, I turned your light off, but go ahead and renew your light and we'll get to you first. Senator Klein, Coordsen, and Wesely, do you wish to address the amendment?

SENATOR KLEIN: Just for a second.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Klein.

SENATOR KLEIN: That really did take care of one of the...the problem that I had with the bill, so in that case I would say I would support this amendment that Mr. Lynch brought this morning. Thank you.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Coordsen.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Thank you, Mr. President. Essentially the same thing that Senator Klein said. We had a problem with the bill because when you get out to the hinterlands of Nebraska, as it were, it would be a difficult bill to implement. And we found in some of the other statewide efforts to implement, for an example, the state electrical code there were a number of problems that were created in the areas where there were not a ready availability of inspectors, and in a matter of fact in some cases, poorly trained inspectors. And I think that this amendment will make it a workable bill and will apply in those areas where it should apply. Thank you.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Thank you, Senator Coordsen. On the Lynch amendment, Senator Wesely. Senator Lynch, there are no further lights on wishing to address this amendment. Closing is waived. The question is the adoption of the Lynch amendment to the committee amendments. All in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Record.
