

SPEAKER WITHEM: The Lynch amendment is adopted. Now back to the amendment that was printed in the Journal, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Yes, sir, Senator Lynch, that amendment is on page 1211.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Lynch.

SENATOR LYNCH: Mr. Speaker and members, I apologize for the confusion, but I appreciate the support for the amendment. This amendment, found in your book, simply replaces the language that pertains to the 1996 code, which is in the bill, and suggest we adopt a 1993 uniform code. The reason for that is that the '93 code is, in fact, in place, has worked, has been adopted, seems to be fair, and is working well, whereas the '96 code really hasn't been completely purified, in a sense, as it applies to areas in the country. And as it applies, uniform code enforcement caused some concern and confusion, and I agree with that. So, therefore, this amendment would replace the '96 ANSI code with a '93 ANSI code.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Thank you, Senator Lynch. Senator Wesely, do you wish to address this amendment? No. Senator Lynch, no lights on, do you have a closing? The question is the adoption of the Lynch amendment. All in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Record.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of Senator Lynch's amendment to the committee amendments.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Lynch, you would be given the opportunity to open on the bill. Oh, we have not adopted the committee amendments, excuse me. Anything further on the committee amendments? Further discussion on the committee amendments? I assume my two lights that are on were waiting to address the bill itself, so we will...the closing on the committee amendments, Senator? Closing is waived. The question is, shall the committee amendments be adopted? All of those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Record.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of committee amendments.

SPEAKER WITHEM: The committee amendments are adopted. Now,
