But the reason, as all of us know, for the prototype is for the members of the Legislature to get a feel of what's suggested and for each of you, for each of you, to have the opportunity to make suggestions for improvements or additions or things that you feel might make a system work better. This effort with the Chamber prototype is extremely important because, from the information we receive from your trials, your use, your comments, is what we will build a future Chamber automation...full Chamber automation system from. So, I understand that we have heavy workloads throughout the rest of the session, but certainly would want to invite you on your individual time within the session, if you feel a little free, to drop back to the back desk, take a look, take the opportunity to play with it, if I can coin that phrase to see, what do you think? Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Thank you, Senator Coordsen. We will now go to General File. Mr. Clerk, LB 108.

CLERK: LB 108, Mr. President, introduced by the Natural Resources Committee. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 6 of last year, at that time referred to Natural Resources. The bill was advanced to General File. Senator Beutler is chair of the committee, presented the committee amendments on March 13 of this year. When the Legislature left the bill that day, there was pending to the committee amendments, an amendment by Senator Dierks that is found on page 1239 of the Journal.
