SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Would like to request a call of the house, roll call vote.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Question is, shall the house go under call? All of those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Record.

ASSISTANT CLERK: 15 ayes, 0 nays to go under call, Mr. President.

SPEAKER WITHEM: The house is under call. Members, please return to the Chamber. We are considering the adoption of the Maurstad amendment. Unauthorized parties leave the floor. Members in the Chamber please check in. Mr. Clerk, who are we looking for? Senator Lindsay, Senator Matzke, please return to the Chamber. Senator Bromm, Senator Robak. Senator Hudkins. Members, we are under call. Senator Lindsay. Question...a roll call has been requested. Mr. Clerk, call the roll.

ASSISTANT CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See page 1456 of the Legislative Journal.) Vote is 12 ayes, 23 nays on the Maurstad amendment.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Amendment is not adopted. Mr. Clerk, any motions?

ASSISTANT CLERK: Mr. President, a priority motion. Senator Bernard-Stevens would move to reconsider the adoption of the Maurstad amendment.
