SPEAKER WITHEM: Thank you, Senator Cudaback. Senator Bernard-Stevens followed by Senators Schimek, Landis, Will and Abboud.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. Senator Cudaback, will you also support this type of motion on LB 108 when we get to that point when Senator Dierks keeps us to 12 hours? Senator Cudaback.

SENATOR CUDABACK: I guess we're not there yet.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: That's not the question. When we are there, will you support this motion, this type of motion to cease debate to cut off Senator Dierks?

SENATOR CUDABACK: As I found out in this body, when you commit to something, we can change our minds quite easily.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: I thank you, Senator Cudaback. And quite honestly, your answer is a proper one. And members of the body, I don't...we have the rules so that you can stop that, you can stop what I'm doing and it is perfectly within your right. In fact, if I would have asked for a roll call vote the last time, I'm allowing you to do this. All I had to do was ask for a roll call vote, not vote, in fact, I already filed the reconsideration motion assuming I was going to do that and I did not. I simply voted yes, didn't ask for the roll call vote. So I actually allowed Senator Cudaback to follow with the motion and I hope the body understands that. This bracket...the bracket motion we had is not anything to talk about at this point, but I will say a couple of things. Senator Cudaback and actually to the body, the way that the bill is at this point is unacceptable. At this point, there is going to be difficulty on Final Reading. I can assure you of that. On the other hand, I may feel a lot better after what we do on LB 1114 and LB 299. But members of the body, without talking about the arguments I've had before, just look at one particular part of the bill and ask yourself why. We are going to not do an experiment as Senator Cudaback now has said. We're not doing an experiment. We're doing a policy now on voting. We're going to do mail-in voting. That's fine. But Senator Cudaback's bill excluded us. Now think about that. It's going to be good for the
