SENATOR WEHRBEIN: And how much...

SENATOR WARNER: ..(inaudible) revenue that is transferred over to the operation of General Fund. There may be some instances of that. Only that portion that is transferred would be state aid, all...I believe it is all inclusive of all state aid that would go to local governments except special ed.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: And that will be a flat percent, again.

SENATOR WARNER: It will be 3 percent the first year, with a vote of the board to go over.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: And a 1 percent the second...

SENATOR WARNER: And 1 percent the following year, as it would be...would stand now. You know, all of this I see the Legislature, in this whole process that we are going to be going through over the next two years, the next session, where we start to get indications of what savings and cost-effective operations can be done, we are going to be looking at all of these to accommodate the ultimate goal of restructuring and trying to get some cost-effective government. But I don't know what changes will be proposed. I do know that we are going to be looking at mandates in a variety of ways, some of which probably are good, some of which maybe could be adjusted, but...

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: And then after that, would go to the levy limits beyond that.

SENATOR WARNER: The levy limits would take effect July 1 of 1998, but we're talking about two legislative sessions,...

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Right.

SENATOR WARNER: ..'97-98 to make...to look at whatever adjustments becomes appropriate.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: All right. Thank you. That's the overview I wanted. That's the way I understood it. I wanted to clarify it. Thank you.
