SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Okay, and so that's not impacted. That's not taken away or added to...

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: No.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: ...that's...

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: No.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: ...that's my point. So what really funds this Municipal Equalization Fund? What's the...besides the insurance premium tax, what more money goes into that?

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: The 3 percent administrative fee...

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: All right.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: ..that we collect when we collect the city sales tax and send that back to the municipalities, that fee is also going to go into the fund.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Those two issues...those two, then?
