SENATOR MAURSTAD: Okay. Thank you.

SENATOR WILL: Thank you, Senator Maurstad. Senator Robinson.

SENATOR ROBINSON: Mr. President, members of the body, Senator Kristensen.

SENATOR WILL: Senator Kristensen, would you respond?

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Yes.

SENATOR ROBINSON: On the public safety commission, the county can put a five cent sales tax in and the...

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: No. No. No. The sales tax is only up to the amount...it's maxed out at a cent and a half. That's what the max is for city sales tax.

SENATOR ROBINSON: Yeah.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: So that's as high...

SENATOR ROBINSON: But it would be a county sales tax.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Yes, except that if a city has a sales tax...

SENATOR ROBINSON: Yeah, they don't...you don't tax that?

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Right. You don't double...

SENATOR ROBINSON: That's not included.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Right.

SENATOR ROBINSON: That's not included.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: For example, if Minden has a city sales tax,...

SENATOR ROBINSON: Yeah.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: ...one cent, and the county puts one in, in Minden it isn't two cents, it's only one cent.
