SENATOR ROBINSON: Now the...all of this has to be voted on by the...who has to? Do they have to vote on it?

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: The countywide sales tax, yes.

SENATOR ROBINSON: Okay.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: The nickel on the property tax, no.

SENATOR ROBINSON: No. Okay.
