SENATOR McKENZIE: Well, the other example I would use, looking at the variance in terms of the municipal levies in my county ranging from \$1.35 to \$.12, based on the population in those communities, in that equalization formula that establishes need, I would have some communities, especially those at high levels, the \$1.35, \$1.23, who would potentially receive some of the equalization aid because they had low resources and low population. Correct?

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Right. They probably have a higher levy, they probably have lower...
