

be more, as much or more assistance than this, along with this, or in complementing this?

SENATOR WESELY: Yes, Senator Vrtiska, the Judiciary Committee did look at the courts and the jails, and I know that's part of the effort Senator Warner was referring to. So there are other options as well.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Well, I understand that, and of course the more money we heap on this probably the harder it's going to be to get, to get passed. The only thing I would like to do, and I'll quite on this because I know it's not going to, it's not going to go very well, but I'd like to see an adjustment in the formula that...

SENATOR WILL: One minute.

SENATOR VRTISKA: ...some of these smaller counties are not getting the breaks that some of the larger counties, and I'd like to see that formula adjusted, but I don't imagine I'll get a lot of support on that because there aren't that many of us little folks here. So I guess I'll just leave with that. But I do, I do think that, that the whole proposition has some merit. And with that, thank you.

SENATOR WESELY: Thank you.

SENATOR WILL: Thank you, Senator Vrtiska. Senator Robak, on the committee amendments.

SENATOR ROBAK: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, members of the body. I have been daydreaming here all this time because of this property tax. I'm kind of wondering what I'm going to do with all my relief. I'm going to have a check for \$1,000 in my pocket someday, maybe I'll have more than that with this bill now because this \$20 million shift now is a \$30 million shift. So I mean...you know, if we do all this property tax relief and this one got in with the property tax relief bills, I mean we're really going to be wealthy someday. So I guess I've been...my mind's been wandering and I'm just trying to see what I'm going to do with all my money that'll save someday, I'm going to get back, I should say. Senator Matzke said that the telephone calls, and I...and letters that I got were from people protecting their own turf. And I don't...they were really, in
